The BNJ Foundation is a non-profit organization with the mission to foster, promote and support the health education and welfare of the poor, in general, and disadvantaged children, in particular, in the United States and throughout the world, while encouraging public awareness and understanding of the needs of the poor for better education and healthcare.

During 2011, as part of its education and outreach mission, the BNJ Foundation engaged in the following activities: the foundation's Website has been designed with the goal of providing a comprehensive Website to keep the public informed about news updates, feature statistics which will be updated regularly as well as news articles validating these statistics. We utilize our Website to impact the lives of millions and engage in a multitude of social issues.

Current work includes the development of a prospect list of persons who may be interested in providing financial donations, solicitation of support from corporations and local business community, the writing of grant proposals soliciting funds from foundations and governments. Program Activities

Projects in Cameroon

The goal of our project is to increase the ability for positive change, enhance health and wellbeing, and promote free society. Some of our projects include:

- *The PES project:* Volunteers, community and family members Join us as we work to provide the needed with the basic necessities such as gloves, bandages, alcohol pads, toothbrushes, mosquito nets, bar soaps, blood pressure monitors, glucose meter and test strips, thermometer, stethoscope etc.
- *The Avocado Group project:* We help empower the villagers to grow avocado and market it. Support a street child: We worked with the government to get street children a home.

- *The gloves project:* We save lives by donating a pair of gloves to a patient visiting the emergency room so they can not be send back home
- *Help a child read:* Please help us as we collect novels, non-fiction, historical fiction, autobiographies, mysteries, humor comic books and put smiles in children faces with reading.
- *Disabled Equipment Assistance and Rehabilitation:* (DEAR) Help assist disable with the equipments to support their basic needs and help rehabilitate them.
